

DOOR COUNTY CHERRY FACTS:

There are **approximately 2,500 acres** of cherry orchards in Door County.

There are around **50 additional acres** devoted to growing sweet cherries, which is plenty to supply our roadside markets.



Cherry trees typically bloom during the middle to the end of May.

Door County orchards typically harvest between 8-12 million pounds of cherries each year.

Door County currently ranks as the **fourth largest cherry producer** of tart cherries in the nation.

Cherries are ready to pick around 60 days after petal drop, which typically puts the harvest in the mid-July to early August time frame each year.

Other than pick-your-own options, most of the cherries in Door County are mechanically harvested by cherry shakers.

It takes a mechanical harvester around 7 seconds to shake a cherry tree, and a mechanical harvester can shake anywhere from 60-100 trees per hour.

Montmorency cherries (tart cherries) are the most commonly grown variety in Door County. Bing, Balaton and other varieties are grown, but in much smaller quantities.

The waters surrounding Door County help moderate the weather and make the area **ideal for cherry growing.**

Cherries aren't the only crop grown here. Door County is also home to more than 550 acres of apple orchards and 50+ acres of grapes.

The average cherry tree contains around 7,000 cherries. That's enough cherries for about 28 cherry pies or 30 bottles of cherry wine per tree!

All but 100 acres of Wisconsin's red cherry crop are grown in Door County.
