Don't wait for them. Come on out some Tuesday nights and say HI!



A great flight on Air Tahiti Nui. First stop is at the Intercontinental Resort in Papeete. After the long flight we just wanted a refreshing drink. It wasn't refreshing after the price, 2 screwdrivers \$42. Luckily we were here years ago and were prepared. We had one suitcase full of booze and snacks. We wanted to see the downtown life, only to find out everything closes at 6pm and the bars open at 11. We did go to the park which offers a variety of truck food. Cox and Kings had the best poison cru. Which is raw fish marinated in coconut milk and hot peppers. A short flight and a boat ride and we're at Tikehau. Basically a great sand bar with a few beach bungalows. It was perfect. Quiet, good snorkeling and no one around. It was like having your own island. Next stop is Huahine. Another short flight and a boat ride, we arrive to our deep overwater bungalow. Again very quiet, but you could take the boat shuttle to a small village and buy alcohol and snacks. Which worked out good cause we had to replenish our stock. They had a "Yacht Club"

which had reasonable prices and a happy hour. Our deep water bungalow had an outstanding view with the back drop of Bora Bora. Last night there it rained and everything shut down. Boat ride, another flight and another boat ride we arrive at Tahaa. (the vanilla island) A deluxe property, a private island with outstanding service. We had a deluxe sunset overwater bungalow. Can't really describe this place. Probably the best place we ever visited. Jump off your platform and you could walk hundreds of yards in waist deep water and all sand. Eagle Rays, Puffer fish and small sharks are abundant. On the side of the island there were coral gardens of beautiful coral and plenty of colorful fish. Everything about this place was awesome, including the refreshing infinity pool. It was hard to believe that 17 nights in the Tahitian islands was over.
