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

Grassy Island Range Lights, Inc.

One of the greatest assets of your yacht club lies to the west end of our harbor, the Grassy Island Range Lights. Since 1966 they have been on the club's property. The taller of the two was used for several years as the cloak room for the club house. After the current clubhouse replaced it's predecessor, the lights fell into disrepair. Members of your club decided they were worth saving. They were moved to the current location on the break wall on the west side of our harbor. Then the work began to restore the structures to their current condition. Ongoing maintenance is required to keep them looking good. Many of our members over the years have been active in the restoration and maintenance of the lights. Most of the current "lighthouse keepers" are of such an age that they are concerned who is going to maintain the lighthouses when they have passed. This was reinforced with the passing of Lighthouse Keeper Jack Hanitz this last week. If you enjoy the sight of the lights as the sun sets in the west and the lights at night, then vou are a lighthouse keeper wannabe. As a vacht club member, vou have an opportunity to get involved. Washing windows, scraping and painting, scrubbing floors, no task is that tough but need to be continued. And it's even fun. Really!
