The way the system works is, you must either request a dollar amount of fuel or a gallon amount ... so, you need to know approximately how much fuel you will need. Once that amount of fuel is dispensed the pump will shut off. All who have used the new fuel system thus far give it a thumbs up! Mason Lipinski is our new Fuel Dock Attendant and is doing a fantastic job. Fuel Dock hours are as follows:

Wednesday: 4:00 - 8:00 Thursday: 4:00 - 8:00 Friday: 4:00 - 8:00 Saturday: 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. Sunday: 9:00 - 3:00 p.m.

Any questions please feel free to call me @ (920) 621-4497 thanks. Notice to all Marina Dock Floaters, please sign in and out of the slip you are floating in and whenever you make a move. This is extremely important for accurate records and accounting information.

Hi everybody, the grounds are shaping up with the hiring of Mason our gas dock attendant. I am working on getting the supplies and a sprayer for weed control. I want to thank Wayne Dunbar and the Green Bay Sail and Power Squadron for giving the club a sign, No swimming be aware of stray voltage in the marina or ESD.

ESD is a term that references in-water injuries or fatalities resulting from electrical shock. ESD often occurs when low levels of AC current pass through a person's body, causing paralysis of their muscular and skeletal systems while swimming or otherwise immersed in fresh water. When so paralyzed, the victim is unable to swim or move to safety and, as a result, the victim ultimately drowns. Higher levels of AC current in an ESD incident may result in electrocution. The sign is posted right next to the anchor as you drive into the club. This is something we really all need to keep in the back of our minds. We all know that their is no swimming. But our guest do not and if nothing is said, some one could jump in even as a joke which could end up to be fatal.
