





# **Grassy Island Range Lights**

There is a saying "March, in like a lion, out like a lamb". Well, looks like March 2023 did a flip flop. The lion roared! Let's hope the April showers bring May flowers and warm weather and the tease for a great boating season.

April also means that it is Tuesday night lighthouse night. Yup, when the lighthouse keepers gather to work on the various projects needed to keep them upright and beautiful. Y'all come on down! Most of the regulars on Tuesday night have been doing so for many years, perhaps even many decades. Time to add some new blood! No, we don't want your blood, but some energy expelled sweeping, cleaning, washing, driving nails and screws, painting. You get the point.

Last year we celebrated the 150th birthday of the Grassy Island Range Lights. We welcomed many visitors for that celebration. In addition to the birthday and the dedication of the David L and Rita E Nelson Lighthouse Park, there were other events where we were able to show off the results of the efforts of the lighthouse keepers. 2023 will again include many of these events. The Door County Lighthouse Festival (https://issuu.com/doorcountyliving/docs/2023-annual-lighthouse-tour-issuu) Summer and Fall being the most prominent of them.

Just an fyi: In the early 19th century, lighthouses weren't particularly good at steering ships away from land, as the most common lenses used in lighthouses at the time, known as Lewis lamps, were not nearly powerful enough. Enter French inventor Augustin-Jean Fresnel, who in 1821 introduced his eponymous lens. The Fresnel lens used a series of prisms to focus all the light from a lamp in one direction and magnify it into a much more powerful beam. Soon, Fresnel lenses were installed in lighthouses all over the world. Not only did they offer vastly improved functionality, they were also stunningly beautiful. The Fresnel lens was so revolutionary that the technique is still used today in flood lights and professional lighting equipment.

Your Grassy Island Range Lights have replica 6th order Fresnel lenses. Come on out, climb up to the lantern room and view the dedication plates on the base of the lights to learn who donated the funds to purchase the lights and check out the beauty and engineering that went into creating these amazing devices.
