



Dockside Power News; This spring the electrical Ground Fault Protection system was revisited. All the safety settings have been restored to comply with current code. This has been done for the safety of everyone.

All dock pedestals, receptacles, breakers, shore power cables, and power distribution panels and breakers have been traced, checked, and are labeled or in the process of getting labeled.

If anyone is experiencing issues when connecting to the Dock Pedestals, please talk/text to Mike Skorczewski, 920-362-1505, slip 77, or Dick Heinz, 920-366-4100, or any Board Member. We are happy to check out the system, pedestal, etc. Please help bygiving us the label info from the pedestal breaker, such as, S3-D19 PDP3A 8, so that we know where to do the checking.

What does the label mean?Receptacle number: S3Dock pedestal: D19Power dist: PDP3ACircuit breaker: 8As of this writting, we are aware of some bad circuit breakers which are on order and set to be replaced as soon as they arrive. Let us know if you have any question
