GRASSY ISLAND RANGE LIGHTS

Your Grassy Island Range Lights enjoyed the privilege of participating in the Door County Lighthouse Festival June 9 thru 11. An interesting mix of people, some whom are light house venturers and others who visited a lighthouse for the first time. Some were from Green Bay who did not know these lighthouses were even here.

All of this was a very powerful experience for this writer. Over the previous 22 years as a lighthouse keeper, involved in replacing rotten wood with new, replacing the old siding with new cedar shake siding and applying the new white paint, it has been inspiring. Then, in 2005 sharing the dedication with local political figures as well as the two individuals who were the primaries in the restoration, David Nelson and Merlin Baenen.

Over time the break wall upon which they stand was being washed away by the flow of the river on the west side, and something needed to be done or we could lose the lights. A lot of time and effort was put forth by the lighthouse keepers to raise enough money to rebuild the break wall. Preliminary plans were drawn up and estimates gotten on the cost. A fund drive was undertaken with reasonable results. Not enough to do the job right but enough to save the lights.

Within the next year David Nelson passed away. A couple of Grassy Island Range Lights board members were asked to meet with the Community Foundation for the Greater Fox Valley Region. Subsequent to that meeting an announcement was made in May of 2018 that the David L and Rita E Nelson Fund within the Foundation, would provide the Grassy Island Range Lights with the necessary funds to rebuild the break wall. Awesome!

On September 17, 2022, your Grassy Island Range Lights celebrated the 150 year anniversary of the lighthouses and the dedication of the David L and Rita E Nelson Memorial Park. The lighthouses stand at the West end of our harbor in testimony to the significant part that they served in the growth of Green Bay as a commercial port and how lighthouses over the world aid in navigation on our waterways and save lives.

As members of the Green Bay Yachting Club, you are a part of their long term presence here. Stop on out and share the ambiance they bring to your club and the entrance to Green Bay. And perhaps consider being a lighthouse keeper and come on out on Tuesday night and lend a hand to their longevity.
