LEASE COMMITTEE - VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

GBYC Announcement for the formation of a Lease Committee:

The GBYC holds a lease with NEW Water, Inc. (the brand of the Green Bay Metropolitan Sewerage District). This document describes all the property currently leased by the GBYC and any conditions which apply to those properties. Our current lease went into effect on July 1, 2009, with a term of 20 years. It will expire on June 20, 2029. The lease states that negotiations toward renewal or termination can commence after 15 years from the date of lease execution, or June 20, 2024. Five years to develop a new lease may seem like a long time, but history has shown this to be a slow process. Issues may arise which require involvement from outside sources (real estate appraisers, Brown County Planning, etc.) which can take months. The Lease must be approved by the NEW Water Commission, which can also take a substantial amount of time.

In order to shepherd this process through to its best conclusion, the GBYC Board has approved the formation of a Lease Committee. Anyone with interest in serving on this committee is welcome to volunteer. Previous experience in real estate, county government or other related expertise is desirable. One Board member will also participate on the committee. John Kennedy, who has served as liaison with NEW Water for many years, will organize and facilitate the committee. The total duration of the committee will be five years, though it is likely that most of the work will be done in relatively short time periods. The committee will meet with NEW Water officials as necessary, and will report back to the GBYC Board.

If interested in serving, please contact John at captjohn652@gmail.com or 920-265-3270 preferably by July 5 so that results can be presented to the Board at their July 8, 2024 meeting. A kickoff meeting for the committee will hopefully be scheduled for later this summer.





GRASSY ISLAND RANGE LIGHTS

There are 48 lighthouses in Wisconsin. There are 779 lighthouses in the United States. There are between 18,600 and 20,000 lighthouses in the world. WOW! Your Grassy Island Range Lights are a tiny portion of that number, yet we attract a few hundred people each year to admire them and the effort that has been expended over the years to preserve them.

The United States is home to impressive historic places, and while its lighthouses might not be the oldest buildings in the world, they are certainly among the most stunning, and some of them predate the formation of the country. Many of these ancient buildings were rebuilt after the original ones suffered destruction in various forms.

They showcase impressive architecture and come in various shapes, sizes, and colors. These lighthouses have the primary purpose of ensuring that ships and boats arrive and leave the harbors safely.

What is it about lighthouses that attract people to them? Because each has their own story. They are unique within themselves.
