### **TREASURER**

Hey there, Fellow GBYCers!

Here we are well into the winter storage season. Thanks to all of you who have already properly submitted the application and payment. Your club needs 1) your winter storage application, 2) payment for your winter storage (including lifts and pressure washing), and 3) a copy of the Certificate of Insurance (COI) from your insurance agency. The latter is often confused with things like an insurance policy declarations page or a copy of your insurance card. Those things, however, are not enough for the club to have proof that your boat is insured. A COI is issued directly from an insurance agency and most often directly to GBYC. This form will specifically say "Certificate of Insurance" at the top.

Since the club does not currently have a good way of verify which of you has submitted the proper COI, would each of you with boats in winter storage at the club please contact your insurance agency and have an extra copy of your boat's COI sent? Even if you think that you've already done this, please do it again. It's OK if we get multiple copies of COIs for your boat! We need at least one for each boat out there!

Also, please note that per the club rules (see excerpt below), GBYC should be listed on your boat insurance policy as an "additional insured" or "holder." While you're on the phone with your insurance agency to get the club a COI for your boat, please be sure to add or verify that. This way, the club will be informed by the insurance company if you accidentally miss an insurance payment or if for some other reason your insurance lapses and your boat becomes uninsured.

All of this is important because an uninsured boat in the harbor or on the club grounds could put the club at legal and financial risk if something bad happens. Help keep your club safe by taking this extra step for us all today. Thanks!

#### INSURANCE CERTIFICATES & USE OF HARBOR/STORAGE\*

- 30. Any member using the harbor (dock holder, floater, storage, travel lift, gas, etc.) must have a Certificate of Insurance, sent by their insurance company with GBYC listed as a holder, on file with the Fleet Captain. The COI must be received every year on the renewal date of insurance. Any uninsured boat must be removed from GBYC property. In the event of non-renewal, the member will have 30 days to remove the boat. If it is not, the GBYC will obtain insurance on the boat and the cost will be charged back to the member. The COI should be sent either by mail (PO Box 485, Green Bay, WI 54305) or email (gbyc485@gmail.com).\* In the event of the sale of a boat, it's the club member's (seller's) responsibility to make sure the boat is insured until it leaves club property. Club member (seller) is responsible for said boat until it leaves the GBYC property.

In other treasury news: September 2025's club financials are now in the book at the clubhouse. Please take a look and read the summary. This month, I've also included some basic graphs showing how sales are down for the club this year. Our cash situation is still strong and you'll see that the club overall is "back in the black" year-to-date. 2025 will likely be closer to a break-even year than a huge net income year. 

And how did they get there? UP, UP, and Away! Lift courtesy of Commodore Jim Thompson.

Over the years, with the saving of the Grassy Island Range Lights, there was one amongst the lighthouse keepers who desired to put a Kahlenberg air horn system at the lights. Got it done! The Kahlenberg air horns have a BEAUTIFUL sound. They will be heard when a ship enters port (and someone is present to acknowledge it) with the Captains Solute.

They will also be used with the Veterans Day celebration at the GBYC as a Service Solute at the end of the program. (Note, a great deal was given to the Grassy Island Range Lights as the lighthouse keepers who visited Kahlenberg are veterans.)
